## Artist in Residence Program Contract

All application material must be submitted by mail and received by the closing date of this announcement, January 15, 2009. Mail application material to:

The Artist-In-Residence Program at Zion National Park offers professional writers, composers, and visual artists the opportunity to pursue their artistic discipline while being surrounded by the park's inspiring landscape. The selected artist will be given either rent-free use of a campsite in the main canyon area of the park, or a furnished park house in the eastern section, at a slightly higher elevation. Selected artists will stay in the park for a minimum of four weeks beginning March 15, 2009. A small reimbursement for food may be available.

In return, participating artists are asked to:

1. Comply with all National Park Service and Zion National Park policy.
2. Donate to Zion Natural History Association (ZNHA) an original piece of artwork from, and representative of their residency in Zion National Park. ZNHA will select the piece to be donated. Donated artwork must be received no later than six months after an artist's residency.
  - a. Artwork from visual artists should be framed with glass (if appropriate) and prepared for hanging before donation.
  - b. Artists are also required to provide the copyright for this artwork to ZNHA. Artwork may be used in exhibits and for educational purposes by ZNHA.
  - c. The artist retains a royalty-free, nonexclusive use license under the copyright of the art.
  - d. ZNHA owns the artwork and the rights to reproduce it. Under those rights, the artist has a license to make use of the artwork for his or her purposes. When artists reproduce artwork for their own purposes, publication information will include the language: "This artwork was produced under the Artist-In-Residence Program at Zion National Park."
  - e. ZNHA may select one or more pieces of visual artwork from the donations to become a part of the Park's permanent museum collection. The National Park Service will not allow the commercial use of any donated artwork once it is selected and accessioned into the Park's permanent museum collection.
  - f. Any pieces of original artwork selected by ZNHA will become a part of their art collection and may also be used in various fund raising events sponsored by the Zion National Park Foundation.
