



Watchman Campground Regulations

Reservations for the summer season (early March through mid-November) can be made at www.recreation.gov, by calling 1-877-444-6777, or in person at the campground. Reservations may be cancelled, without refund, if campsite is not occupied by 11:00 a.m. on the day after your scheduled arrival or if the site is unoccupied for 24 hours.

Etiquette

- Check out time is 11:00 a.m.
- Quiet hours are 10:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. Generators are not permitted at any time.
- Do not move picnic tables.
- Tents and vehicles must not be on vegetation.

Limits

- 6 people per campsite, including children.
- 1 RV per campsite max height 13' / (3.96m) (RV, 5th wheel, camper trailer, cabover, camper van, etc.).
- Sites without an RV may have 2 vehicles/trailers per campsite or 4 motorcycles.
- C/D Loops only accommodate vehicles with combined length less than 19' / (5.8m)
- Tent pads can accommodate 1 large, 2 medium or 3 small tents at most sites.
- Length of stay is limited to 14 total days from March-Thanksgiving and 30 additional from Dec-Feb30

Parking

- All vehicles, including trailers, must be kept in parking areas, not on vegetation.
- Overflow parking is available at the amphitheater in B loop, in South Campground amphitheater parking lot and in the Zion Canyon Visitor Center parking lot.

Food Storage and Sanitation

- Food must be stored in a vehicle or hard-sided lockable container. *Feeding wildlife is prohibited.*
- Black water must be disposed of at the dump station, not on ground, in river, or in irrigation ditches.
- Grey water (dishwater and solar shower) must be dumped down drains near the water spigots outside each restroom or at utility sinks at new restrooms. RVs may dispose of grey water at the dump station.
- Bathing and washing of food, clothing, or dishes at public faucets or in restrooms is prohibited.
- Showers and laundry are available for a fee in Springdale.
- Do not leave trash unattended. Dispose of trash in dumpsters. Leave campsites and fire rings free of litter. Recycling stations located throughout campground.

Fires and Firewood

- Check with a park ranger or campground host for information on fire restrictions.
- Wood gathering is prohibited.
- Fires are allowed in fire grates at each site. *Do not leave fires unattended.*
- Fireworks are prohibited in Zion National Park.

Pets

- Pets must be restrained at all times. Leashes must be no longer than six feet.
- Hiking with pets is allowed only on roads and the Pa'rus Trail.
- Unattended pets making unreasonable noise are prohibited.
- Pet owners must pick up and properly dispose of pet excrement.

Recreational Equipment

- Bicycles are allowed only on the paved Pa'rus Trail and park roads.
- In-line skates and non-motorized scooters are allowed only on campground roads and Pa'rus Trail.
- River tubing and skateboarding are prohibited.
- Attaching or suspending any item from trees which may cause damage, including swings, candles, and lanterns, is prohibited. Use of nails, wire or chains is prohibited.
- Installation/use of any sports equipment that would cause resource damage--e.g. slacklines, horseshoes
- Clotheslines may be no longer than 15 feet and are restricted to one clothesline per site.
- Installation of sports equipment such as horseshoe pits and stakes, volleyball nets, etc. is prohibited.
- Use of firearms is prohibited. Use of OHVs and ATVs is prohibited.

Walk-in Sites F Loop

- All tents must stay on established tent pads. Sites will accommodate 1 medium tent or 2 small tents.
- All campsite activities (cooking, congregating) must stay within the delineated area. Use of other areas is not permitted.
- Sites do not accommodate the gathering of large groups within one site. You may use the common campfire areas for congregating near sites 7 and 15.
- Picnic tables may not be moved out of the campsite or to another location within the campsite.
- There is only one designated parking stall for each campsite. Additional vehicles will need to park in overflow parking areas.
- Please remain within delineated areas of each campsite and on designated paths.
- Food storage boxes are provided at each campsite. All food must be kept secure in the box or hard-sided container.


